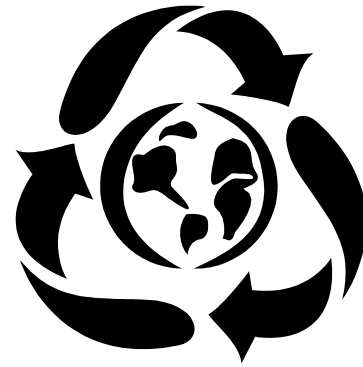


**Recycling Update:**



**What Goes in Your Recycling Bin?**

Is it really recyclable? The new **“All-in-One”** Recycling program allows residents to put quite a few recyclable items in the gray recycling cart. Here’s a reminder of what can be recycled:

<b>What CAN Go In:</b>	<b>What CAN’T Go In:</b>
Newspaper, All mixed paper, Magazines, Paper bags	Plastic bags (Take these to your local grocery store)
Corrugated cardboard	Styrofoam containers or ‘peanuts’ (Contact local mailing business for peanuts drop off opportunities)
Metal, Glass, Plastic	Window panes
Beverage containers	Incandescent or florescent light bulbs (contact Alameda County Household Hazardous Waste for proper disposal at: 800-606-6606)
Aluminum	Wood
Scrap metal	Food containers
Empty aerosol cans	Food soiled paper (napkins, etc.)

Did you know commercial recycling is available at no additional charge?***

That’s right – no additional expense is required for adding recycling service at your business. Waste Management will deliver a 32-gallon gray cart, and all recyclable material is collected in the single container so there is no need to separate recycling.
